











### Share of respondents who perceive the organization as relevant (%)




### Share of respondents familiar with the organization (%)


#### **UN Development System effectiveness: Familiarity**






Share of respondents familiar with the area and who perceive the area as effective (percent)




### **UN Development System potential**




Share of respondents who believe that delivering as one enhances the UN development system in terms of efficiency (percent)




Share of respondents who believe that delivering as one enhances the UN development system in terms of quality (percent)














Share which findss the area to be highly effective (%)



High income and low income countries Share which finds the area to be highly effective (%)




